Rationale

FSC requires Group Entity to maintain centrally records of actual or estimated annual harvesting and FSC sales volumes of the group (Clause 10.1, f of <FSC-STD-30-005 V2.0, Forest Management Groups>).

the records of actual annual FSC sales volumes can be verified from the independent third-party Biometria rather than the Group Entity.

Swedish forest owners are not obligated to sell their wood to the Organization holding the FSC group certificate. Due to the existing Competition Act, Group Entities, often large forest companies, should not collect information from forest owners regarding FSC sales volumes. This leads to the risk that the Group Entity might inadvertently discover which other actors the forest owners have sold their wood to, along with other sensitive business-related information. If Group Entities request this information, it could enable them to identify the actions of individual competitors in the market and obtain an aggregated market picture that other competitors do not have access to. Consequently, gathering information about sales volumes could give Group Entities a competitive advantage, thereby violating applicable legislation.

Given the numerous large wood procurement companies in Sweden, the large number of forest owners, and the high proportion of certified forest land, an impartial economic association Biometria has been established to measure and account for all wood sales on the Swedish market. This economic association operates independently from wood procurement companies and Group Entities and tracks sold FSC volumes for each forest owner. Both forest owners and wood procurement companies can track sold FSC volumes through the economic association.

These transactions are still verified as part of the annual FSC audits.

PSU Conclusion

PSU grants the derogation for group forest management certifications in Sweden that the records of actual annual FSC sales volumes can be verified from an independent third party rather than the Group Entity.

The certification body may verify the FSC sales volume using data collected by the independent and legally registered body <u>Biometria</u>.

The certification bodies shall inform its group forest management certification clients in Sweden about this derogation.

Note: FSC monitors the implementation of this derogation and will update or withdraw the derogation in full or part, as necessary.
