CLR manual: Background





2021 Introduction of FSC Core Labour Requirements (CLR) in Chain of Custody

- Major change to CoC
- Gaps in competence of social auditing



2022 ASI analysis identified gaps in application of CLR in most countries

Legal Framework and Country Risk Analysis Report (Oct, 2022)



2023 4 in-person training and calibration workshops in 'high risk' countries delivered by ASI and attended by 111 auditors:

- Türkiye
- China
- Indonesia
- India

CLR manual: Background



An outcome recommendation of the calibration workshops included more training in social auditing for CBs



2024 FSC requested ASI to develop training materials for all CBs, for them to train their auditors

- **Primary target**: Trainers in all CBs who train auditors on FSC requirements
- Overall target: All FSC CoC auditors
- Main Objectives:
 - To increase awareness and improve competence of Auditors on the evaluation of FSC CLRs.
 - o To create basic knowledge of risk areas and checkpoints during audits.
 - To ensure a common and unified understanding among Auditors on the interpretation of the FSC normative requirements and their verification methodology.

COURSE DESIGN PRINCIPLES

1. Audience: FSC CoC Auditors

(to fill competence gaps)

- 2. Target users: Training Providers & CBs
- 3. Format: Blended Training
 - Pre-course (off-site)
 - In-person/Live-Online-Training component (LOT)

- 2) Training process and methodologies (suitable for in-person/online)

Analysis of ASI compliance assessment findings relevant to FSC CLR/ILO



Survey of CBs' current training methods for FSC CLR



Preparation of materials based on feedback, analysis & learnings



Field-testing materials



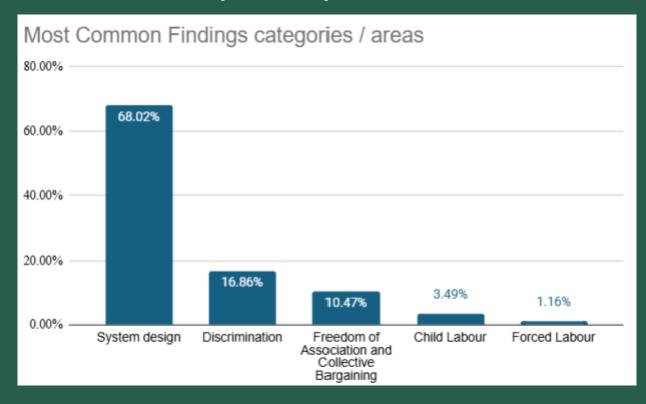
Refinement based on feedback to create final package.

ASI Analysis



ASI conducted both qualitative and quantitative analysis based on ASI Findings data to better understand challenges and recurring issues.

Quantitative Analysis Example



Reporting

- 47 countries in FSC CoC assessments
- Findings containing keywords re. CLR
- Findings raised under FSC-STD-20-011 V4-2, 11.3

Analysis

- Trends & frequencies
- Types of issues encountered by CBs
- Potential system weaknesses re. evaluation of CLR
- Majority of ASI NCs (normative reference)



Changes after Testing



Some examples of how feedback has been implemented into the end product.

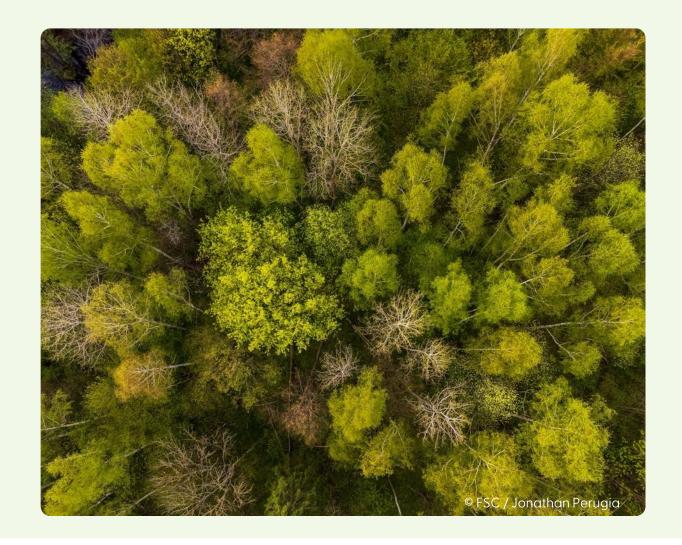
Participant Feedback	Change(s)	Result(s)
 Positive inclusion of real case scenarios. Request for more time for exercises 	 Case scenarios provided prior to course as 'pre-reading'. More information-dense slides moved into pre-course material 	 Clarified cases taken from ASI findings. More time for discussion (in-person).
More detail on audit time allocation.	 Additional exercise included (Module 4.3) 	 To help participants design their audit plans to incorporate CLR evaluation.

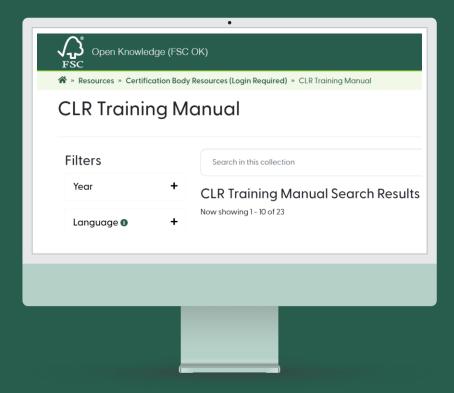

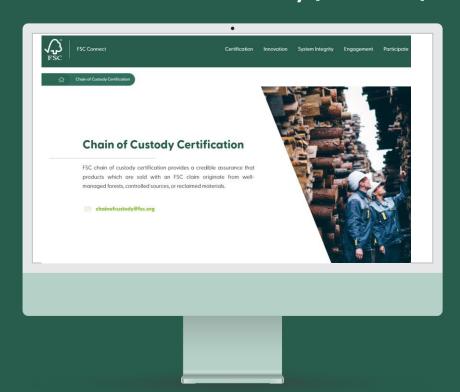

CASE SCENARIOS

Case scenarios cover the different CLRs based on real life examples from ASI findings:

- Child Labour (<u>link</u>)
- Forced Labour (<u>link</u>)
- Discrimination (<u>link</u>)
- Freedom of Association and Collective Bargaining (link)

KEY ASPECTS

PRE-COURSE & POST-COURSE SURVEYS

These elements are for:

- Testing the participants knowledge at the precourse stage (quiz) and after the main course (exam) (link)
- Collecting feedback from the participants <u>prior to</u> <u>the course</u> and <u>afterwards</u>, for learning and improvement purposes.

KEY ASPECTS

What is the exam pass mark?

Suggested pass mark is 70% or above.

When should the exam occur?

No later than 2 weeks after the course.

When should feedback be collected via the surveys?

- Before the main course, with a defined deadline (pre-course)
- At the end of the main course (post-course)

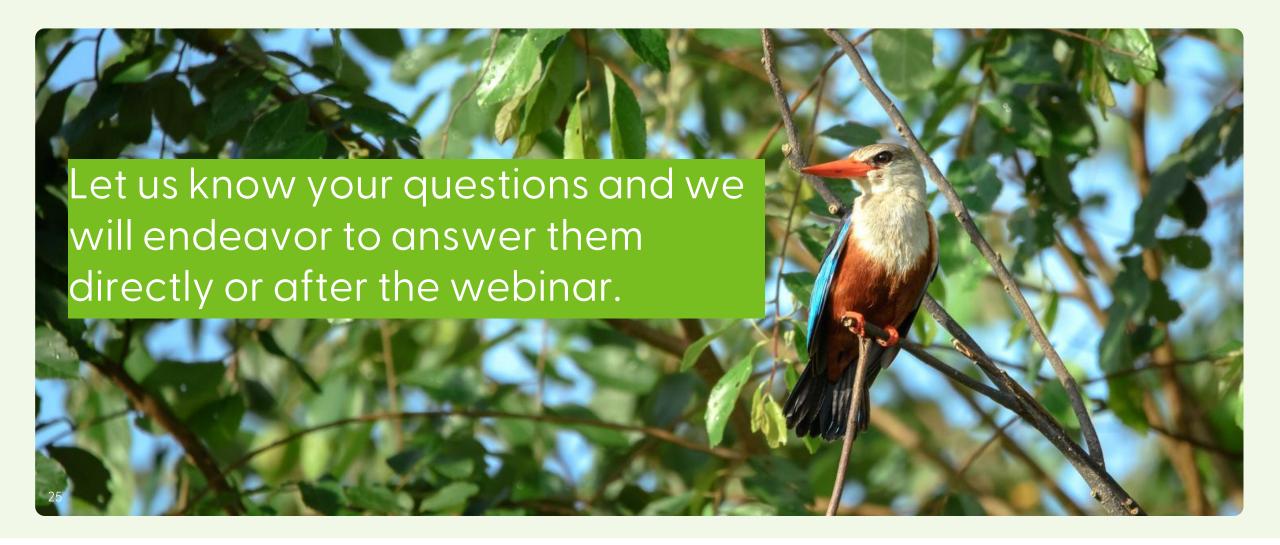
